SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans 13:9-14

⁹The commandments, 'You shall not commit adultery,' 'You shall not murder,' 'You shall not steal,' 'You shall not covet,'¹⁰ and whatever other command there may be, are summed up in this one command: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.'¹⁰ Love does no harm to a neighbour. Therefore love is the fulfilment of the law.¹¹ And do this, understanding the present

time: the hour has already come for you to wake up from your slumber, because our salvation is nearer now than when we first believed. ¹² The night is nearly over; the day is almost here. So let us put aside the deeds of darkness and put on the armour of light. ¹³ Let us behave decently, as in the daytime, not in carousing and drunkenness, not in sexual immorality and debauchery, not in dissension and jealousy. ¹⁴ Rather, clothe yourselves with the Lord Jesus Christ, and do not think about how to gratify the desires of the flesh.

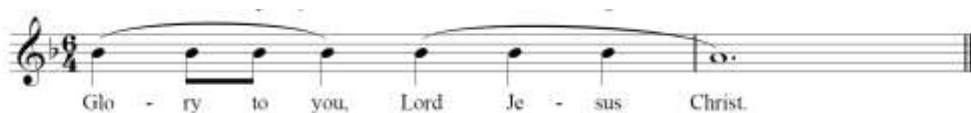

³⁶ 'But about that day or hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. ³⁷ As it was in the days of Noah, so it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. ³⁸ For in the days before the flood, people were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage, up to the day Noah entered the ark; ³⁹ and they knew nothing about what would happen until the flood came and took them all away. That is how it will be at the coming of the Son of Man. ⁴⁰ Two men will be in the field; one will be taken and the other left. ⁴¹ Two women will be grinding with a hand mill; one will be taken and the other left. ⁴² 'Therefore keep watch, because you do

not know on what day your Lord will come. ⁴³ But understand this: if the owner of the house had known at what time of night the thief was coming, he would have kept watch and would not have let his house be broken into. ⁴⁴ So you also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him.

ANGELA PEVERELL ORDAINED PRIEST

Angela Peverell was ordained priest in the Church of God by Bishop Peter Stuart in Christ Church Cathedral, Newcastle yesterday on St Andrew's Day 30 November 2019. It was a moving and joyous occasion, celebrated by a large congregation with parishioners Caroline Bowyer, Esme Parker and Barbara & Bruce Gordon present.

Angela is a former parishioner of St Peter's having moved into the parish in the 1990s with her two young children Matthew and Katherine. The family became very involved in parish life and Angela was later invited to assume the role of Head Server. She took to the role with passion and was influential in maintaining our traditional high standard of liturgical worship having been trained at St Alban's, Epping.

The family moved to Pymble in 2012 and Angela worshipped at St John's Gordon. Later she moved to Christ Church St Laurence where she was again engaged as a server in the sanctuary. It was here that she felt God's call to offer for ordination to the Bishop of Newcastle Diocese.

On acceptance, she moved to Newcastle Diocese, completing the formation program and a Bachelor of Theology through Trinity College, Melbourne. She served in lay ministry at St Peter's East Maitland and Christ Church Cathedral. She was an active member of the Movement for the Ordination of Women.

Angela was ordained Deacon by Bishop Peter Stewart in Christ Church Cathedral on 30 June 2019 and ordained Priest on Saturday 30 November. We are thankful for Angela's many and varied gifts and pray that as a priest, she will be able to use them for the extension of God's kingdom.
