³⁴ Then Peter began to speak: 'I now realise how true it is that God does not show favouritism ³⁵ but accepts from every nation the one who fears him and does what is right. ³⁶ You know the message God sent to the people of Israel, announcing the good news of peace through Jesus Christ, who is Lord of all. ³⁷ You know what has happened throughout the province of Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John preached – ³⁸ how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and power, and how he went around doing good and healing all who were under the power of the devil, because God was with him. ³⁹ 'We are witnesses of everything he did in the country of the Jews and in Jerusalem. 

FR TIM'S ASSIGNMENT TO THE BUSH FIRE AREA

The Wardens wish to let you know that the Army called up Fr Tim in his role as Army Chaplain as part of the Army's role in supporting the victims of the ongoing terrible bush fires. It is likely Tim will be away for all of January.

For the Parish this calls on us to have temporary measures with visiting Clergy conducting our services. Rev'd Michael Kellahan will celebrate the 7am Eucharist and 9am Sung Eucharist this Sunday. Mak will conduct the 11am Contemporary service and the 2.30pm Bougainvillea service. Bishop Peter Watson will celebrate the 10am Eucharist on Tuesday.

For us it is also recognition of Tim's wider role in the military and in giving help to communities suffering from the fires.

We are in an area where the worst discomfort from the fires is smoke and grey skies. It is a small sacrifice to know Fr Tim is seeking to provide support to troops experiencing the horrors of the bush fire ravages and also, in all probability, providing comfort to those who have lost homes. animals, livelihood and experienced horrendous anguish and terror.
