We have sinned against you in thought, word and deed and in what we have failed to do. Only you can save us. Father, forgive us.

Help us to love you and all people, and to live for your honour and glory; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

ABSOLUTION

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of Exodus 16:2-15

² In the desert the whole community grumbled against Moses and Aaron. ³ The Israelites said to them, 'If only we had died by the LORD's hand in Egypt! There we sat round pots of meat and ate all the food we wanted, but you have brought us out into this desert to starve this entire assembly to death.' 4 Then the LORD said to Moses, 'I will rain down bread from heaven for you. The people are to go out each day and gather enough for that day. In this way I will test them and see whether they will follow my instructions. ⁵ On the sixth day they are to prepare what they bring in, and that is to be twice as much as they gather on the other days.' ⁶ So Moses and Aaron said to all the Israelites, 'In the evening you will know that it was the LORD who brought you out of Egypt, ⁷ and in the morning you will see the glory of the LORD, because he has heard your grumbling against him. Who are we, that you should grumble against us?' 8 Moses also said, 'You will know that it was the LORD when he gives you meat to eat in the evening and all the bread you want in the morning, because he has heard your grumbling against him. Who are we? You are not grumbling against us, but against the LORD.' Then Moses told Aaron, 'Say to the entire Israelite community, "Come before the LORD, for he has heard your grumbling." ¹⁰ While Aaron was speaking to the whole Israelite community, they looked towards the desert, and there was the glory of the LORD appearing in the cloud. ¹¹ The LORD said to Moses, ¹² I have heard the grumbling of the Israelites. Tell them, "At twilight you will eat meat, and in the morning you will be filled with bread. Then you will know that I am the LORD your God." 13 That evening quail came and covered the camp, and in the morning there was a layer of dew around the camp. 14 When the dew was gone, thin flakes like frost on the ground appeared on the desert floor. 15 When the Israelites saw it, they said to each other, 'What is it?' For they did not know what it was. Moses said to them, 'It is the bread the LORD has given you to eat.

Hear the Word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

PSALM 105:1-6, 37-45

Give praise to the LORD, proclaim his name; make known among the nations what he has done.

- Sing to him, sing praise to him; tell of all his wonderful acts.
- Glory in his holy name; let the hearts of those who seek the LORD rejoice.
- Look to the LORD and his strength; seek his face always.
- Remember the wonders he has done, his miracles, and the judgments he pronounced,
- you his servants, the descendants of Abraham, his chosen ones, the children of Jacob.
- He brought out Israel, laden with silver and gold, and from among their tribes no one faltered.
- Egypt was glad when they left, because dread of Israel had fallen on them.
- He spread out a cloud as a covering, and a fire to give light at night.
- They asked, and he brought them quail; he fed them well with the bread of heaven.
- He opened the rock, and water gushed out; it flowed like a river in the desert.
- For he remembered his holy promise given to his servant Abraham.
- He brought out his people with rejoicing, his chosen ones with shouts of joy:
- he gave them the lands of the nations,
 and they fell heir to what others had toiled for –
- that they might keep his precepts and observe his laws.

 Praise the LORD.

SECOND READING

A reading from the book of Romans 15:1-13

We who are strong ought to bear with the failings of the weak and not to please ourselves. ² Each of us should please our neighbours for their good, to build them up. ³ For even Christ did not please himself but, as it is written: 'The insults of those who insult you have fallen on me.' 4 For everything that was written in the past was written to teach us, so that through the endurance taught in the Scriptures and the encouragement they provide we might have hope. ⁵ May the God who gives endurance and encouragement give you the same attitude of mind toward each other that Christ Jesus had, ⁶ so that with one mind and one voice you may glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. Accept one another, then, just as Christ accepted you, in order to bring praise to God. 8 For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the Jews on behalf of God's truth, so that the promises made to the patriarchs might be confirmed ⁹ and, moreover, that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written: 'Therefore I will praise you among the Gentiles; I will sing the praises of your name.' 10 Again, it says, 'Rejoice, you Gentiles, with his people.' 11 And again, 'Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles; let all the peoples extol him.' 12 And again, Isaiah says, 'The Root of Jesse will spring up, one who will arise to rule over the nations; in him the Gentiles will hope.' ¹³ May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Hear the Word of the Lord, thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew 20:1-16 **▼ Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ**

For the kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out early in the morning to hire workers for his vineyard. ² He agreed to pay them a denarius for the day and sent them into his vineyard.

³ 'About nine in the morning he went out and saw others standing in the market-place doing nothing. ⁴ He told them, "You also go and work in my vineyard, and I will pay you whatever is right." ⁵ So they went. 'He went out again about noon and about three in the afternoon and did the same thing. ⁶ About five in the afternoon he went out and found still others standing around. He asked them, "Why have you been standing here all

day long doing nothing?" ⁷ "Because no one has hired us," they answered. 'He said to them, "You also go and work in my vineyard." ⁸ 'When evening came, the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, "Call the workers and pay them their wages, beginning with the last ones hired and going on to the first." ⁹ 'The workers who were hired about five in the afternoon came and each received a denarius. ¹⁰ So when those came who were hired first, they expected to receive more. But each one of them also received a denarius. ¹¹ When they received it, they began to grumble against the landowner. ¹² "These who were hired last worked only one hour," they said, "and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden of the work and the heat of the day." ¹³ 'But he answered one of them, "I am not being unfair to you, friend. Didn't you agree to work for a denarius? ¹⁴ Take your pay and go. I want to give the one who was hired last the same as I gave you. ¹⁵ Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?"

This is the Gospel of the Lord, Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.
