A Child will come out and stand next to the minister and engage in the following dialogue explaining the Lord's supper:

Child: Why is this meal different from other meals?

Minister: We were slaves to sin, but the Lord saved us by his mighty strength. He saved us just as he promised so that we might be blessed and live forever with him.

This is what God has promised to all who turn to Jesus as Lord and Saviour:

Jesus said:

"Come to me, all you who are weary and are carrying heavy loads. I will give you rest." Matthew 11:28

"God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son. Anyone who believes in him will not die but will have eternal life." John 3:16

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give thanks and praise.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy, at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise, holy Father, heavenly King, almighty and eternal God.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father,

Minister:(Breaking the bread)

On the night before he died, Jesus took bread and he broke it and shared it with his friends.

Child: What is the meaning of this special bread?

Minister: Jesus said, "Take and eat. This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me"

This bread reminds us of Jesus' body which was given on the cross for us. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Yes, we praise and thank you!

Minister: On the night before he died, Jesus took the cup of wine and shared it with his friends.

Child: What is the meaning of the special wine?

Minister: Jesus said, "Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins."

This wine reminds us of Jesus' blood which was shed on the cross for us. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Yes, we praise and thank you!

Minister: Therefore Father,

We thank you for these gifts of bread and wine.

We eat and drink trusting that Jesus died to forgive us for our sins.

We eat and drink trusting that Jesus rose again so that we, too, will live forever with him

We will eat and drink this special meal until the great banquet in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Come King Jesus, come.

The bread is distributed to all who are to receive it. Then the minister will say:

Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.

The wine and grape juice is distributed to all who are to receive it. The minister will say:

Drink this in remembrance that Christ's blood was shed for you, and be thankful.

After Communion, the minister prays: Loving Father, through faith in your Son and his saving death, our sins are forgiven and we share in the life of his body.

With gratitude for all your mercies, we offer ourselves to you as a living sacrifice, through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

OLD TESTAMENT READING

FIRST READING

A reading from the book of the prophet Isaiah 40:21-31

²¹ Do you not know? Have you not heard? Has it not been told you from the beginning? Have you not understood since the earth was founded? ²² He sits enthroned above the circle of the earth, and its people are like grasshoppers. He stretches out the heavens like a canopy, and spreads them out like a tent to live in. ²³ He brings princes to naught and reduces the rulers of this world to nothing. ²⁴ No sooner are they planted, no sooner

are they sown, no sooner do they take root in the ground, than he blows on them and they wither, and a whirlwind sweeps them away like chaff.

²⁵ 'To whom will you compare me? Or who is my equal?' says the Holy One. ²⁶ Lift up your eyes and look to the heavens: who created all these? He who brings out the starry host one by one and calls forth each of them by name. Because of his great power and mighty strength, not one of them is missing. ²⁷ Why do you complain, Jacob? Why do you say, Israel, 'My way is hidden from the LORD; my cause is disregarded by my God'? ²⁸ Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and his understanding no one can fathom. ²⁹ He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. ³⁰ Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; ³¹ but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

PSALM 147:1-11

- Praise the LORD.

 How good it is to sing praises to our God, how pleasant and fitting to praise him!
- The LORD builds up Jerusalem; he gathers the exiles of Israel.

- ⁵ Great is our Lord and mighty in power; his understanding has no limit.
- the LORD sustains the humble but casts the wicked to the ground.
- Sing to the LORD with grateful praise; make music to our God on the harp.

- He covers the sky with clouds; he supplies the earth with rain and makes grass grow on the hills.
- He provides food for the cattle and for the young ravens when they call.
- His pleasure is not in the strength of the horse, nor his delight in the legs of the warrior;
- the LORD delights in those who fear him, who put their hope in his unfailing love.

SECOND READING

A reading from Paul's first letter to the Corinthians 9:16-23

⁶ For when I preach the gospel, I cannot boast, since I am compelled to preach. Woe to me if I do not preach the gospel! ¹⁷ If I preach voluntarily, I have a reward; if not voluntarily, I am simply discharging the trust committed to me. ¹⁸ What then is my reward? Just this: that in preaching the gospel I may offer it free of charge, and so not make full use of my rights as a preacher of the gospel. ¹⁹ Though I am free and belong to no one, I have made myself a slave to everyone, to win as many as possible. ²⁰ To the Jews I became like a Jew, to win the Jews. To those under the law I became like one under the law (though I myself am not under the law), so as to win those under the law. ²¹ To those not having the law I became like one not having the law (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law), so as to win those not having the law. ²² To the weak I became weak, to win the weak. I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some. ²³ I do all this for the sake of the gospel, that I may share in its blessings.

GOSPEL READING

A reading from the holy gospel according to Mark 1:29-39

▼ Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ

²⁹ As soon as they left the synagogue, they went with James and John to the home of Simon and Andrew. ³⁰ Simon's mother-in-law was in bed with a fever, and they immediately told Jesus about her. ³¹ So he went to her, took her hand and helped her up. The fever left her and she began to wait

on them. ³² That evening after sunset the people brought to Jesus all who were ill and demon-possessed. ³³ The whole town gathered at the door, ³⁴ and Jesus healed many who had various diseases. He also drove out many demons, but he would not let the demons speak because they knew who he was. ³⁵ Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. ³⁶ Simon and his companions went to look for him, ³⁷ and when they found him, they exclaimed: 'Everyone is looking for you!' ³⁸ Jesus replied, 'Let us go somewhere else – to the nearby villages – so that I can preach there also. That is why I have come.' ³⁹ So he travelled throughout Galilee, preaching in their synagogues and driving out demons.
