A banner procession takes place with the sanctuary party and wardens processing around the church. The procession includes the banner for St Peter, our 'patron' saint; St Andrew (who with Mary is 'patron' of our chapel); and the Children's Centenary banner. The procession pauses at the St Peter window and the window is censed and the Collect prayed. Incense is a symbol of the prayers of God's people.

FIRST READING


A reading from the book of the Acts of the Apostles 12:1-11

¹ It was about this time that King Herod arrested some who belonged to the church, intending to persecute them. ² He had James, the brother of John, put to death with the sword. ³ When he saw that this met with approval among the Jews, he proceeded to seize Peter also. This happened during the Festival of Unleavened Bread. ⁴ After arresting him, he put him in prison, handing him over to be guarded by four squads of four soldiers each. Herod intended to bring him out for public trial after the Passover. ⁵ So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him. ⁶ The night before Herod was to bring him to trial, Peter was sleeping between two soldiers, bound with two chains, and sentries stood guard at the entrance. ⁷ Suddenly an angel of the Lord appeared and a light shone in the cell. He struck Peter on the side and woke him up. 'Quick, get up!' he said, and the chains fell off

Peter's wrists. ⁸ Then the angel said to him, 'Put on your clothes and sandals.' And Peter did so. 'Wrap your cloak round you and follow me,' the angel told him. ⁹ Peter followed him out of the prison, but he had no idea that what the angel was doing was really happening; he thought he was seeing a vision. ¹⁰ They passed the first and second guards and came to the iron gate leading to the city. It opened for them by itself, and they went through it. When they had walked the length of one street, suddenly the angel left him. ¹¹ Then Peter came to himself and said, 'Now I know without a doubt that the Lord has sent his angel and rescued me from Herod's clutches and from everything the Jewish people were hoping would happen.'

⁶ For I am already being poured out like a drink offering, and the time for my departure is near. ⁷ I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. ⁸ Now there is in store for me the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will award to me on that day – and not only to me, but also to all who have longed for his appearing. ¹⁷ But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength, so that through me the message might be fully proclaimed and all the Gentiles might hear it. And I was delivered from the lion's mouth. ¹⁸ The Lord will rescue me from every evil attack and will bring me safely to his heavenly kingdom. To him be glory for ever and ever. Amen.


The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 21:15-22



The Gospel is censed with the prayer that God will place his word in our minds, on our lips and in our hearts.

¹⁵ When they had finished eating, Jesus said to Simon Peter, 'Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?' 'Yes, Lord,' he said, 'you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Feed my lambs.' ¹⁶ Again Jesus said, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' He answered, 'Yes, Lord, you know that I love you.' Jesus said, 'Take care of my sheep.' ¹⁷ The third time he said to him, 'Simon son of John, do you love me?' Peter was hurt because Jesus asked him the third time, 'Do you love me?' He said, 'Lord, you know all things; you know that I love you.' Jesus said. 'Feed my sheep, ¹⁸ Very truly I tell you, when you were younger you dressed yourself and went where you wanted; but when you are old you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will dress you and lead you where you do not want to go.' ¹⁹ Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death by which Peter would glorify God. Then he said to him, 'Follow me!' ²⁰ Peter turned and saw that the disciple whom Jesus loved was following them. (This was the one who had leaned back against Jesus at the supper and had said, 'Lord, who is going to betray you?') ²¹ When Peter saw him, he asked, 'Lord, what about him?' ²² Jesus answered, 'If I want him to remain alive until I return, what is that to you? You must follow me.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

THE GREETING OF PEACE


We are the body of Christ His Spirit is with us.

NEWS FROM THE BISHOP OF BATHURST

Last Sunday 23 June, Bishop Mark Calder announced that The Rev'd James Boardman has accepted his invitation to serve as the next Priestin-Charge of the parish of Holy Trinity, Kelso, from the beginning of 2025. Holy Trinity is approx. 7kms from All Saints Cathedral, Bathurst where many of us went to be present at James' Ordination. The Bishop writes: "James will bring to this role, a deep understanding of and appreciation for history; a love for traditional liturgical worship and the church calendar, and a genuine love for senior Christians from whom he wishes to learn. And yet James also appreciates the importance of a less formal style of service – still liturgical – still Anglican – but that which is easier for non-church younger families to participate in and hear the Good News. I am so grateful to God for this appointment and look forward to how the Lord will use James (along with Charly) in the great work of SHARING JESUS FOR LIFE in the parish of Kelso."
