All communicants of other churches are invited to join us in the sharing of Holy Communion. If you are not a communicant we encourage you to come forward for a blessing. Please indicate your desire for a blessing by holding your hands behind your back as you kneel or stand at the Communion Rail.

We request that people do not use the practice of 'intinction' at Communion (dipping the bread into the wine) for hygiene reasons. If you are concerned about the use of the common cup, it is acceptable for you to receive Communion in one kind (i.e. the bread only).

*The celebrant and other communicants receive the Holy Communion. As the sacrament is received the communicant responds: **Amen.***
