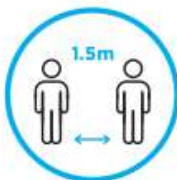

Minister: (Breaking the bread): On the night before he died, Jesus took bread and he broke it and shared it with his friends.

Child: What is the meaning of this special bread?

Minister: Jesus said, "Take and eat. This is my body given for you. Do this in remembrance of me" This bread reminds us of Jesus' body which was given on the cross for us. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Yes, we praise and thank you!

Minister: On the night before he died, Jesus took the cup of wine and shared it with his friends.

Child: What is the meaning of the special wine?

Minister: Jesus said, "Drink from this, all of you. This is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins."

This wine reminds us of Jesus' blood which was shed on the cross for us. Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Yes, we praise and thank you!

Minister: Therefore Father, We thank you for these gifts of bread and wine. We eat and drink trusting that Jesus died to forgive us for our sins. We eat and drink trusting that Jesus rose again so that we, too, will live forever with him. We will eat and drink this special meal until the great banquet in the Kingdom of Heaven.

Come King Jesus, come.

The bread is distributed to all who are to receive it.

Then the minister will say:

Take and eat this in remembrance that Christ died for you, and feed on him in your heart by faith with thanksgiving.

The wine and grape juice is distributed to all who are to receive it.

The minister will say: Drink this in remembrance that Christ's blood was shed for you, and be thankful.

After Communion, the minister prays:

Loving Father,
through faith in your Son and his saving death,
our sins are forgiven and we share in the life of his body.

**With gratitude for all your mercies,
we offer ourselves to you as a living sacrifice,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.
Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your
praise and glory. Amen.**

There will be no more death’ or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away.’ ⁵He who was seated on the throne said, ‘I am making everything new!’ Then he said, ‘Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true. ⁶He said to me: ‘It is done. GOSPEL READING

The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John 11:32-44
✕ **Glory to you Lord Jesus Christ**

³² When Mary reached the place where Jesus was and saw him, she fell at his feet and said, 'Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died.' ³³ When Jesus saw her weeping, and the Jews who had come along with her also weeping, he was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. ³⁴ 'Where have you laid him?' he asked. 'Come and see, Lord,' they replied. ³⁵ Jesus wept. ³⁶ Then the Jews said, 'See how he loved him!' ³⁷ But some of them said, 'Could not he who opened the eyes of the blind man have kept this man from dying?' ³⁸ Jesus, once more deeply moved, came to the tomb. It was a cave with a stone laid across the entrance. ³⁹ 'Take away the stone,' he said. 'But, Lord,' said Martha, the sister of the dead man, 'by this time there is a bad odour, for he has been there four days.' ⁴⁰ Then Jesus said, 'Did I not tell you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?' ⁴¹ So they took away the stone. Then Jesus looked up and said, 'Father, I thank you that you have heard me. ⁴² I knew that you always hear me, but I said this for the benefit of the people standing here, that they may believe that you sent me.' ⁴³ When he had said this, Jesus called in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, come out!' ⁴⁴ The dead man came out, his hands and feet wrapped with strips of linen, and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Take off the grave clothes and let him go.'

This is the gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.**
