## THE FIRST READING

A reading from the Book of **Exodus 34.1-8**

The Lord said to Moses, 'Chisel out two stone tablets like the first ones, and I will write on them the words that were on the first tablets, which you broke. <sup>2</sup> Be ready in the morning, and then come up on Mount Sinai. Present yourself to me there on top of the mountain. <sup>3</sup> No one is to come with you or be seen anywhere on the mountain; not even the flocks and herds may graze in front of the mountain.' <sup>4</sup> So Moses chiselled out two stone tablets like the first ones and went up Mount Sinai early in the morning, as the Lord had commanded him; and he carried the two stone tablets in his hands. <sup>5</sup> Then the Lord came down in the cloud and stood there with him and proclaimed his name, the Lord. <sup>6</sup> And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, 'The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, <sup>7</sup> maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. 

## YEAR TO DATE OFFERINGS

So far this year offertories are running below budget by \$9,438.

Another way to look at things is to compare this year's offertories in the first four months (\$32,898) with last year's during the same period (\$39,127). This comparison produces a lesser decline in offertories of \$6,229, yet that is still fairly pronounced.
